## Keynote Speakers

#### Nelson McCausland MLA

Minister, Department for Social Development

Nelson McCausland MLA is a member of the Democratic Unionist Party (DUP). He was elected as a Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA) first in 2003, and held the office of Minster for Culture, Arts and Leisure from July 2009 - May 2011. Nelson was educated at Carr's Glen Primary School, Belfast Royal Academy, Worcester College, Oxford, and Queen's University Belfast. He was first elected to Belfast City Council in 1989 to represent the Castle area of North Belfast and held the position of High Sheriff of Belfast in 1997. Nelson has taken a particular interest in human rights, equality, culture and education during his time at the Northern Ireland Assembly and, in 2007, represented the DUP on the Bill of Rights Forum.

#### Alex Attwood MLA

Minister, Department of Environment

Alex Attwood MLA took up his post as Minister of the Environment in May 2011. He was Minister for Social Development in the last Northern Ireland Executive. Appointed in 1997 by John Hume to the Dublin Forum for Peace and Reconciliation, Alex's commitment to an all-Ireland agenda is close to his heart. As a member of the SDLP Talks Team, he played a key role negotiating role on policing, human rights and justice issues in 1998 and since. Alex was the SDLP spokesperson on policing and was appointed to the Northern Ireland Policing Board in September 2001 on which he served until 2007. During this time he was influential in the implementation of many of the recommendations of the Patten report. He was first elected to the Northern Ireland Assembly in 1998 and has been re-elected three times since.
